The Casa Grande at Almaden Quicksilver County Park, the second oldest structure in Santa Clara County. Built in the 1850s, the building was once home to the mine manager during the Gold Rush days and after the discovery of quicksilver in the hills of New Almaden. The home has undergone a complete restoration and will reopen on this day with a Grand Fiesta Celebration, including : Open House Tours, Food Booths, Carnival Festivities, Ceremonies, Entertainment, and Fun Games for All.

Patterson wed Clara Hawley in 1877, his gift to her was a Queen Anne addition onto the 1857 family farmhouse. The docents not only point out the interesting features of the house, but add spice with family stories.
